The Council met as a Board of Adjustment to consider a request for a permitted exception, as allowed by the rules and regulations of the St. Martin Parish Zoning Ordinance. The Council met as a Board of Adjustment to consider granting an exception to allow for the temporary experimental placement of a composting site on property zoned as R-2 (Mixed Residential), located at the Cade Farm, 1178 W.J. Bernard Road, owned by University of Southwestern Louisiana/University of Louisiana at Lafayette. Parish President Chester Cedars gave a factual background, stating that the 600 acres in which the Cade Farm is located was purchased in 1978, prior to the zoning ordinance being adopted in 1995. W.J. Bernard is currently zoned R-2 (Mixed Residential) which does not allow for composting. Parish President Chester Cedars Council stated he was contacted late last week by the University requesting the temporary, experimental placement of a composting site be conducted from September 2, 2018, through November 30, 2018. Parish President Chester Cedars mentioned he has reviewed the Memorandum of Agreement which was submitted by the University to Department of Environmental Quality and Louisiana Department of Agriculture for this experimental project. Parish President Chester Cedars stated this 600 cubic yards site poses no danger to the aquifer, no odors emitted and will only receive waste from the

Louisiana Ragin Cajuns and some solid waste from the agriculture and forest management activities. Parish President Chester Cedars stated because of the time frame of this project and the parameters of our zoning ordinance, it wouldn't be approved until November. Parish President Chester Cedars advised the Council what they are being requested to do would be to suspend the enforcement of the zoning ordinance relative to this 600 cubic yard site only. Parish President Chester Cedars informed the University that after November, if the data allows them to experiment further, the University would then have to go through the usual process of amending the zoning ordinance. Council Member Lisa Nelson advised she was contacted by Ms. Gretchen LaCombe Vanicor, Director of Sustainability, University of Louisiana at Lafayette, and after a detailed explanation of the plans and concerns, Council Member Lisa Nelson has no objection to the temporary experimental placement of a composting site and will also consider any future request pending any compliance and/or complaints from this waiver. Ms. Gretchen LaCombe Vanicor presented to the Council a detailed description of this small scale, pilot project. On-file is the correspondence from Ms. Gretchen LaCombe Vanicor to Mr. Joey Breaux, Director of Soil & Water Conservation District Programs, LDAF-Office of Soil & Water Conservation and a Best Management Practices Plan. A general discussion ensued amongst Council Members and Ms. Gretchen LaCombe Vanicor. Ms. Vanicor stated [during the process of the experiment] both Department of Environmental Quality and Louisiana Department of Agriculture will have an oversight of the project. Ms. Vanicor also assured the Council Members there will be staff, faculty and students on-site every day managing it very carefully. Ms. Vanicor mentioned the waste will be controlled. The University has a contract with Republic Services, and there will be a designated amount of waste that will be transported by Republic; anything exceeding this amount will be transported to a landfill. Ms. Vanicor stated they are prepared to halt this experiment and move the waste off at any given moment under the advisory of the Department of Environmental Quality, Louisiana Department of Forestry and Agriculture, St. Martin Parish Government or the University of Louisiana at Lafayette.

ORDINANCE NO. 18-08-1236-OR

An Ordinance to amend and/or revise Article I of Chapter 26 of the St. Martin Parish Code of Ordinances by the repeal, revision, enactment, and/or re-enactment of Section 26-3.3 of the said Chapter 26, all relative to the jurisdiction of the Justices of the Peace and Constables and the division of fines paid in accordance with violations of the St. Martin Parish litter ordinances.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Parish Council of St. Martin Parish, Louisiana, duly convened in regular session on the 7th day of August, 2018, that:

Article I of Chapter 26 of the Code of Ordinances for St. Martin Parish, Louisiana, be amended by the repeal, revision, enactment, and/or re-enactment of Section 26-3.3, solely and exclusively, as regards the jurisdiction of the Justices of the Peace and Constables and the division of fines imposed for litter violations:

Section 26-3.3. Jurisdiction of Justices of the Peace; Constables; Division of Fines.

A. A litter violation may be brought in any Justice of the Peace court of St. Martin Parish, Louisiana. In addition, a Constable may issue a summons and serve a subpoena anywhere within St. Martin Parish, Louisiana, all in accordance with La. R.S. 13:2586. Whenever a Justice of the Peace exercises jurisdiction to adjudicate litter violations, the prosecution of such offenses shall be in accordance with the dictates of La. R.S. 13:2587.1, where applicable.

B. A Justice of the Peace shall be compensated Twenty-Five and No/100 (\$25.00) Dollars for each litter violation which is heard before the court. For each fine and administrative fee paid by mail, the Justice of the Peace shall receive the sum of Seven and 50/100 (\$7.50) Dollars.

Moreover, whenever a Justice of the Peace hears a matter involving a litter violation, the Constable for the ward in which the matter is heard shall also receive the sum of Twenty-Five and No/100 (\$25.00) Dollars for each such proceeding. Additionally, the Constable shall receive Seven and 50/100 (\$7.50) Dollars from each fine and/or administrative fee imposed and shall be compensated whether the fine or fee is paid by mail or as a consequence of a litter proceeding before the Justice of the Peace.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED by the St. Martin Parish Council that the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and if any provision, word, phrase, or clause of this ordinance, or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof which can be afforded efficacy without the invalid provision or application.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall become effective immediately upon approval by the St. Martin Parish Council and the signature of the Parish President.

SUMMARY NO. 1237-OR (Introduced by Daniel Richard, Jr., District 9)

An Ordinance to rezone and assign the appropriate zoning classification, with specific conditions, as regards to that certain tract of land situated at 1036 Mitt Naquin Road, Lot 14, St. Martin Parish, Louisiana.

SUMMARY NO. 1238-OR (Introduced by Neil Thibodeaux, District 4)

An Ordinance to amend Chapter 19, St. Martin Parish Zoning Ordinance, Appendix D, Parish Road Zoning Data Sheets of the Code of Ordinances for the St. Martin Parish Government by: Amending Zoning Classification District on a portion of a road zoned in the original ordinance adopted on December 18, 1995. {763.43 foot strip of land running East and commencing at the intersection of Attakapa Drive and Capritto - Forty Arpent Road}

Prior to adjournment Parish President Chester Cedars reviewed several projects and other matters within the parish, as follows:

Henderson Lake Drawdown - Parish President Chester Cedars stated the Henderson Lake Drawdown commenced the morning of August 1, 2018, and is projected to last 7-10 days. Parish President Chester Cedars stated of pertinence was the close monitoring and adhering to the 16 conditions of the permit/approval of the United States Army Corps of Engineers. Parish President Chester Cedars mentioned a diary will be kept of all these events and data for future reference. Parish President Chester Cedars commended the Public Works Department, especially Kelvin Laviolette and Shawn Belaire for their utmost, professional attention.

Bayou Estates Flood Gate Project - Parish President Chester Cedars stated a meeting has been scheduled for August 8, 2018, with Mo Saleh, Professional Engineer, Professional Engineering & Environmental Consultants, Inc., members of Mr. Saleh's staff, Federal Emergency Management Agency, Darin Mann, Office of Community Development, Richard Minvielle, Minvielle & Associates, Inc. and several other State officials recommended by Mr. Mann. Parish President Chester Cedars mentioned his objectives include protecting our funding and developing an acceptable timetable in view of these documents. Parish President Chester Cedars stressed this meeting is for executive discourse and fact finding and is not open to the public.

Council on Aging - Parish President Chester Cedars advised that Council on Aging continues to lament about inadequate funding. It is important that people understand Council on Aging is not part of St. Martin Parish Government; they are a non-profit organization that operates under the auspices of the Governor's Office of Elderly Affairs. After researching, Parish President Chester Cedars noted funding for the Council on Aging is received from the Governor's Office of Elderly Affairs, Cajun Area on Aging (Federal), St. Martin Parish Government, City of Breaux Bridge and the Village of Parks. Parish President Chester Cedars added St. Martin Parish Government also provides the Council on Aging with housing at the Sydnie Mae Durand building. Parish President Chester Cedars also mentioned Council on Aging is the recipient of a federal transportation grant. Parish President Chester Cedars has met with Ms. Shanese Lewis and agreed to assist her in making formal request for more funding for the Council on Aging.

St. Martinville By-Pass - Parish President Chester Cedars stated he has a meeting scheduled for August 9, 2018, with Acadiana Planning Commission and the City of St. Martinville Mayor Melinda Mitchell. Parish President Chester Cedars advised he will not present anything on this matter until he has all the facts and costs.

Louisiana Highway 352/Henderson Levee Road - Parish President Chester Cedars mentioned on July 31, 2018, he met with a number of officials regarding the major issues presented by the condition of the Henderson Levee Road. The attendees were informed that poor conditions of the road north of Pat's Restaurant (that portion being a Parish road) had been successfully repaired by the Parish. Parish President Chester Cedars stated the meeting ended with commitments from Coastal Protection and Restoration Authority researching funding alternatives for both short-term and long-term repairs; the Levee District would seek expanded servitudes needed for repairs; and Department of Transportation and Development would develop planning and design models and prepare cost estimates. Parish President Chester Cedars added St. Martin Economic Development Authority will be instructed to prepare an economic impact study to demonstrate the value of a functional road. Parish President Chester Cedars stated a follow-up meeting will be in approximately ninety (90) days.

NIMS Training - Parish President Chester Cedars advised on August 14, 2018, several members of the administrative staff, public works personnel and himself will participate in a training session in a Federal program known as the National Incident Management System (NIMS).


Public Works Equipment - Parish President Chester Cedars stated St. Martin Parish Government has taken possession of a new, larger excavator as well as a "low-boy." Parish President Chester Cedars mentioned this low-boy will allow our public works employees to move large equipment from one location to another immediately, opposed to having to wait days and often a week.

Use of Public Parks and Community Centers - Parish President Chester Cedars declared how fortunate St. Martin Parish Government is that the electorate has entrusted us with funds to develop our parks and recreational centers. Parish President Chester Cedars added while St. Martin Parish Government must be good stewards with the money, we should also exercise proper judgment in the use of our facilities. Parish President Chester Cedars advised the Council Members several months ago there was a vandalism in the Clayton Boudreaux Memorial Park, located in Catahoula. As part of the plea agreement of the culprits, Parish President Chester Cedars strongly recommended that the parties at fault prepare a letter of apology to the Catahoula community. Parish President Chester Cedars stated two weeks ago, he received that transmittal and immediately had it laminated and posted at the park. Secondly, for the last several years a particular organization has used the Cade

Community Center for an annual event. Parish President Chester Cedars mentioned the crowd at each event has proven to be unruly and have, point blank, “disrespected” the facility. Complaints from the neighborhood have been made, and the enhanced security required of the organization has produced no fruition. Therefore, Parish President Chester Cedars advised that the group would not be allowed to use the Cade Community Center this year. Parish President Chester Cedars met with representatives of the organization and shared with them his concerns. At their request, Parish President Chester Cedars reconsidered his initial decision and did additional research. Parish President Chester Cedars stated those efforts disclosed no basis for him to reverse his prior decision. Parish President Chester Cedars stated the club/organization was advised accordingly.

A motion was made by Lisa Nelson and seconded by Dean LeBlanc that the St. Martin Parish Council does hereby adjourn. Motion was unanimously approved.
