REGULAR MEETING - DECEMBER 4, 2018

The St. Martin Parish Council met in Regular Session convened at 5:03 p.m., Tuesday, December 4, 2018, Carroll J. Fuselier Meeting Room, St. Martin Parish Annex Building, 301 West Port Street, St. Martinville, Louisiana.

Item 7. (C) Formal response to Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development proposal regarding Melvin Dupuis Road. As a reminder, Parish President Chester Cedars gave detailed information at the November 20, 2018 Committee Meeting as follows: The original I-10 Improvements concept included the widening of the mainline bridges over Melvin Dupuis Road from four (4) to six (6) lanes. However, because of complex construction phasing and other issues, the original concept was amended to provide for I-10 to be at ground level in this location and to raise Melvin Dupuis Road over I-10 with a 2-lane bridge. After further deliberation, the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development now proposes that I-10 remain at ground level, but Melvin Dupuis Road be re-configured so as to provide for dead-end installations with cul-de-sacs on Melvin Dupuis on the north and south sides of the road's point of intersection with I-10. Thus, there would be no access across I-10.

Council Member Dean LeBlanc stated he has received several calls opposing the proposal and feels that the funds offered are not more than the negative impact it could have on the area. Council Member Dean LeBlanc made it clear that he was against the proposal. Parish President Chester Cedars reminded everyone this proposal was vetted very thoroughly at the last meeting. Parish President Chester Cedars stated since the last meeting there have been some additional reasons interposed for the objection that needs to be articulated. Parish President Chester Cedars mentioned he has since had a conversation with representatives from the Fire District regarding the effects it would have on the fire department's response time, particularly on the northern portion of Melvin Dupuis Road. Other Council Members interjected with concerns of farmers, school buses, emergency personnel, etc. having to take alternate routes. Council Member Chris Tauzin requested

other options be discussed to try to work with the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development. Parish President Chester Cedars stated he intends to do that after the Council's action this evening.

A PowerPoint presentation (*on-file*) was delivered by Andre Fontana and Brandon Chatham of Blast Tech regarding Ordinance Summary No. 1247-OR {An Ordinance to amend and supplement Ordinance No. 14-11-1083-OR, adding and/or supplementing the specific land use as regards that certain tract of property containing 10.307 acres, more or less, situated at the corner of Maurice Road and Hughes Road.}. Blast Tech has requested to expand their facility. Neighboring property owners, Chuck and Dana Sewell were present and also gave a PowerPoint presentation (*on-file*) with

opposition to Blast Tech's request. Mr. Sewell made it clear he and his wife are not opposed to Blast Tech expanding but felt Blast Tech needed to adhere to their current stipulations before being allowed to expand with more stipulations. After a lengthy discussion between Parish President Chester Cedars, Council Members, Parish Attorney Allan Durand and both parties, this item has been deferred until the February 2019 Regular Meeting.

Upon hearing no further comments from the audience regarding the proposed ordinances being considered for final adoption, the Chairman requested a motion to close the Public Hearing.
