

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE ST. MARTIN PARISH COUNCIL**  
**REGULAR MEETING - SEPTEMBER 4, 2018**

The St. Martin Parish Council met in Regular Session convened at 5:02 p.m., Tuesday, September 4, 2018, Carroll J. Fuselier Meeting Room, St. Martin Parish Annex Building, 301 West Port Street, St. Martinville, Louisiana.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Jason Willis.

The Invocation was read by Laci Laperouse and the Pledge of Allegiance was led by Lisa Nelson.

LSU AgCenter County Agent Stuart Gauthier introduced his staff as follows: 4-H Youth Development Agents Hope Guidry (present) and Hannah T. **RESOLUTION NO. 18-077-RS**

WHEREAS, the Bayou Estates drainage area is subject to flooding due to heavy rain storm events and seasonal weather conditions; and

WHEREAS, additionally the area gets flooded due to very high tide conditions in the adjacent bayou and nearby Lake Palourde; and

WHEREAS, the area has an existing subsurface drainage system which cannot function properly in high water conditions, a frequent scenario for the area; and

WHEREAS, the water in the canals next to this area will rise an average of four (4) feet which will cause the streets and houses to flood; and

WHEREAS, the existing drainage problem also creates problems with the sewer systems backing up; and

WHEREAS, several exclusive flood control measures have been proposed and publicly discussed and studied by different regulatory agencies inclusive of the United States Army Corps of Engineers; and

WHEREAS, a final plan was permitted by the United States Army Corps of Engineers on November 7, 2017, with all other considered alternative measures being rejected; and

WHEREAS, the funding for the project is as follows: HMGP (FEMA) - \$1,114,948.00; CDBG - \$2,286,000.00; and St. Martin Parish Government - \$370,145.00; and

WHEREAS, one of the property owners who had originally agreed to grant the Parish a servitude for the anchoring of a floodgate to a bulkhead, an essential component of the approved flood control plan, has withdrawn his consent; and

WHEREAS, all other servitudes remain committed; and

WHEREAS, St. Martin Parish Government wishes to retain the legal services of Becker and Hebert for the exercise of the Parish's right of eminent domain relative to this project.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the St. Martin Parish Council that Parish President Chester Cedars be authorized to retain the services of Becker and Hebert for the exercise of the Parish's right of eminent domain under Article VI of the Louisiana Constitution, all relative to the Bayou Estates Flood Control Project, and to adopt any all other steps necessary to obtain all

servitudes necessary for the implementation of the approved and permitted plan.

### **ORDINANCE NO. 18-09-1237-OR**

AN ORDINANCE TO REZONE AND ASSIGN THE APPROPRIATE ZONING CLASSIFICATION, WITH SPECIFIC CONDITIONS, AS REGARDS TO THAT CERTAIN TRACT OF LAND CONTAINING 9.496 ACRES, SITUATED AT 1036 MITT NAQUIN ROAD, AND LOCATED IN SECTION 52, TOWNSHIP 8 SOUTH, RANGE 6 EAST, ST. MARTIN PARISH, LOUISIANA.

BE IT ORDAINED by the St. Martin Parish Council that by virtue of this ordinance, and in accordance with Section 2-11 of the Home Rule Charter for St. Martin Parish, Louisiana, and pursuant to the recommendations of the Planning Commission of St. Martin Parish, Louisiana, the following described property shall be rezoned from R-2 (Mixed Residential) to I-1 (Light Industrial):

That certain parcel of ground situated in Section 52, Township 8 South, Range 6 East, St. Martin Parish, Louisiana, being known and designated as TRACT 3-A, containing 9.496 acres on that certain plat of survey prepared by Kappy Callium, PLS dated August 25, 2011, attached to that act recorded under Entry No. 450222 of the records of the St. Martin Parish Clerk of Court's Records.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this zoning classification change is being made to allow for the operation of a tree service company, Possum's Tree Service, at 1036 Mitt Naquin Road, Lot 14, Assessor's Parcel No. 0420003812. The zoning change will be solely and exclusive to the 9.496 acres (Lot 14), more or less, of land outlined in red on the attached plat of survey, prepared by Kappy Callium, Professional Land Surveyor. If a change in this type of business is desired in the future, the change would have to be approved by the Parish Council in the form of an amended ordinance. Once the tree service company is closed or the subject property is no longer owned by Randall James Olivier and/or Crystal Gayle Hollier Olivier, the zoning classification will automatically revert back to the previous zoning classification of R-2 (Mixed Residential).

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the use of the said property for the purposes defined by Appendix A of the St. Martin Parish Zoning Ordinances relative to the I-1 (Light Industrial) classification are hereby restricted as follows:

- A. The property is to only be used for a contractor's shop and parking lot.
- B. The parking lot is solely for company vehicles and employee's personal vehicles.
- C. There is to be a twenty-five (25) foot green space.
- D. Property owners are not required to install a buffer zone because there is no business being conducted on site.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the St. Martin Parish Zoning Ordinances, including, but not limited to, Appendix A attached thereto, be and is hereby amended to reflect the entirety of this edict.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall not affect any other provisions of the St. Martin Parish Zoning Ordinances, and its applicability shall be and is limited to the property described herein.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable, and if any provision, word, phrase, or clause of this ordinance or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof.

This ordinance shall become effective as provided by Section 2-12 of the Home Rule Charter of St. Martin Parish, Louisiana.



The Parish Council of the Parish of St. Martin does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION I: The Parish Road Zoning Data Sheets are hereby amended to change the zoning classification district on a portion of the parish road listed below and to allow the remainder of the road to remain as classified.


**FLOOD MITIGATION ASSISTANCE** - Parish President Chester Cedars stated, appropriated by the 2018 Consolidated Appropriations Act, the Flood Mitigation Assistance (“FMA”) Grant Program provides resources to assist local communities in their efforts to reduce or eliminate the risk of repetitive flood damages to structures insurable under the National Flood Insurance Program. Individual owners may submit applications to FEMA for such assistance between October 1, 2018, and January 31, 2019. **HENDERSON-NINA WATER SYSTEM/BUTTE LAROSE** - Parish President Chester Cedars stated in an effort to introduce potable water services in the Butte LaRose Community, St. Martin Parish Council abolished Waterworks District No. 5 and authorized Parish President Chester Cedars to enter into a Cooperative Endeavor Agreement with the Henderson-Nina Water System to assist it in securing the resources for the provision of water services to the residents of the former Water Works District No. 5. Parish President Chester Cedars will do so at the meeting of Henderson-Nina Board on September 19, 2018, at the Henderson Recreational Center. The time of the meeting is 6:00 P.M., and Parish President Chester Cedars will address any questions about the Parish’s role in this matter.
